under arrest. Come along with me," the actor continued. He said he asked the officer, "Why?" and Reagan replied, "You know as well as I do."

Driscoll and Ferguson were released on habeas corpus writs issued yesterday by Judge Leroy Dawson. Driscoll's bond was \$500 and Ferguson's \$1000. The writs are returnable at 1:45 p.m., July 17, in Department 41.

Sgt. Reagan, in his version of what happened, said he and his partner saw Driscoll and Ferguson eating at the hotdog stand. Within a half hour, the officer related, he and Woodard saw Ferguson alone in the car.

Pair Followed

"When Ferguson spotted us he tried to elude us for some reason. His actions were suspicious. We followed him," Reagan stated.

"We were dressed in sport coats. He knew who we were and he wanted to get away from us right now," Reagan continued.

The detective said he and Woodard followed him for a couple of blocks. He maintained that at Sunset Blvd. and Havorford St., Ferguson threw the cellophane bag with marijuana out of the window of his car, as well as an empty vodka mix bottle.

"We know Ferguson and Driscoll and the company they keep. When Ferguson drove off the way he did, we knew he was up to something," Reagan asserted.
