Ex-Child Star Seized for Dope

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Bobby Driscoll, who won a special Academy award 10 years ago as a child actor, was jailed Sunday on a narcotics booking.

He is 22. As his occupation he gave "unemployed."

Narcotics officers arrested Driscoll, William Bradley, 21, and William Kimbeley, 21, on a Los Angeles sidewalk. Detectives said Driscoll was carrying a hypodermic kit and Bradley a quantity of codeine tablets. The officers said they had had the trio under observation for some time.

They were booked on suspicion of violating the state narcotics law.

Driscoll won a special Academy award for outstanding juvenile performances in "The Window" and "So Dear to My Heart" in 1949. He played a leading role in Walt Disney's "Song of the South."
