

# House Committee Approves \$500 Million for Latin Aid

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Sponsored by the Cuban crisis, the House Appropriations Committee yesterday quickly approved President Kennedy's full request for \$500 million to launch a program of economic help and social progress for Latin America.

Cuba Gets Note The new funds would be disbursed mainly as loans through the Inter-American Bank.

The \$500 million would be merely the first installment. Rep. Albert Thomas, D-Texas, a committee member, said he thought \$100 or \$150 billion program stretching over two decades would be necessary for the area.

## Canadians Brand Castro Regime Red Dictatorship

## 'Staged' Attacks Against U.S. Legations Protested

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The police to prevent the type of State Department says the United States has strongly protested to Russia, Bulgaria and Romania what it described as "staged mob attacks" against the U.S. legations in those countries Tuesday.

The department said these "mob actions" represent "an undesirable development in the maintenance of relations between governments" and "a deterioration in the standards of international practice."

Department press officer Linda White said the mob actions were "just what you would expect" in Eastern Europe by pro-Castro mobs.

The demonstrators were in connection with the rebel anti-Castro invasion of Cuba.

White was asked to explain whether the U.S. charge that the demonstrators were "staged" meant they were directed by the governments of the Communist countries.

# Senate Approves Compromise Depressed Areas Legislation

WASHINGTON (UPI)—A compromise \$394 million depressed areas bill was rushed to passage by the Senate today after President Kennedy interceded to settle a deadlock over financing of the program.

The bill would set up a loan-and-grant program to lure new industries to areas struggling with chronic unemployment. It was Senate approved by voice vote shortly after it was approved by a Senate-House compromise committee.

The compromise immediately was endorsed by Kennedy, who criticized former President Dwight D. Eisenhower for voting two similar bills. The House now is expected to add its endorsement and send the bill to Kennedy to be signed into law.

The House and Senate originally passed conflicting versions of the bill.

The compromise would set up an economic rehabilitation program to encourage new industries to locate in areas suffering from long-term unemployment. It is a key part of Kennedy's priority economic program.

The committee reached agreement after House conferees found in Senate demands that money for the program be raised through Treasury borrowing.
