Ferrari Suspends Racing Program

MODENA, Italy (UPI)—The Ferrari Auto Company today announced that it was "suspending" all racing activities as a result of the outcry which followed last month's disaster in Monza.

The accident, Italy's worst in 33 years, came Sept. 30, when the Ferraris of German ace Wolfgang Graf Berghe von Trips crashed into the grandstands at the 1961 Grand Prix of Modena.

During the disaster, the track was closed and race officials refused to let racing resume.

Driver Eugenio Armano was killed when he ran into the wall, crashing into the wall with such violence that he could not be freed.

Another driver, Giacomo Agostini, was severely injured when he was thrown from his machine.

The accident, which occurred during the race, has caused a great deal of anger and concern among racing fans.
